

Riding an OHM in a Limited Use Forest

Limited Use Forest

The Martineau Recreational Trail System is located in the Paul Bunyan State Forest. This State Forest is classified as “Limited Use”. This means that you may only ride on trails that are specifically marked for OHMs. You may also ride OHMs on the area Forest Roads and roads marked Minimum Maintenance.

OHMs licensed for highway use must also have MN ORV registration to be operated off-road in the State Forest.

You **may not** ride on trails marked only for ATV or walking trails. Look closely, the OHM and ATV stickers are both red and have other similarities.



You **may not** ride an OHM on the shoulder of State and County roads

Caution: All trails and forest roads have two way traffic. Watch for oncoming vehicles and other forest users.

In an emergency, call 911. Use the MN Emergency Trail Locator signs to help responders find your location.

OHM Only

Trails open to OHMs are marked with a 12”x18” Permitted Motorized Uses sign with a red OHM sticker attached or a 4”x4” trail marker with the red OHM sticker attached. Permitted Motorized Use signs are generally used at the start of a trail segment. The 4”x4” trail markers are often used at intervals along the segment to help riders stay on the trail.



Dual Use (OHM & ATV)

Trails open to OHMs and ATVs are marked with a 12”x18” Permitted Motorized Uses sign with a red OHM sticker and red ATV sticker attached or a 4”x8” trail marker with the both stickers attached.



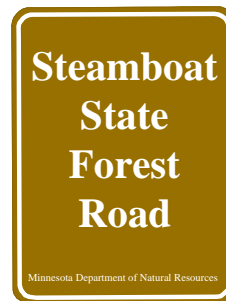

Riding an OHM in a Limited Use Forest

Forest Roads

Area State Forest Roads are open to OHM travel. They are marked with a brown 12"x18" sign with white lettering.

Area Minimum Maintenance Roads are open to OHM travel. They are marked with a yellow 12"x18" or triangular 12"x12" sign with black lettering.



Traffic Control

Traffic control signs are used to mark right of way at intersections and provide an alert at a potentially hazardous crossings. Obey all traffic control signs. They are added for your safety.



Trail Direction

Trail directional signs are used to mark trail intersections and general direction. Trail directional signs are yellow, 9"x12" with black markings indicating the type of trail feature being marked.



MN Trail Locator Signs

Trail locator signs are being placed at trail intersections and selected locations along the trail. When installation is complete, they may be used with your GPS or trail map for navigation. In case of emergencies, you will be able to relay the locator sign address to the 911 operator. Emergency personnel will use it to locate you. All MN Trail Locator Signs on the MRT begin with the letters "UN". See [Using MN Emergency Trail Locator Signs with a GPS](#) at www.paulbunyanforestriders.com.
